Who is affected by the Packaging Act?

On 01 January 2019, the Packaging Act (VerpackG) came into force with important obligations for producers and distributors - even those who place only small quantities of packaging on to the market.

Without exception, everyone who places packaged commercial goods on to the market that end up with the consumer is affected by the Packaging Act. This is the principle of extended producer responsibility (EPR) that operates in Germany. It applies to both large mail order companies and small online retailers. And, as the Act does not stipulate a de minimis amount, it even applies to the smallest quantities.

Every initial distributor must register with the Zentrale Stelle (ZSVR), which is the Central Agency Packaging Register, and license the packaging placed on the market via a packaging compliance scheme.

Failure to comply with these legal obligations can result in a fine of up to €200,000.

Checklist- what you need to do



Register with the ZSVR:

As a party that puts retail packaging on the market, you must register with the ZSVR and subsequently be publicly listed online. Only then are you allowed to put packaging into circulation.



Participation in a packaging scheme:

You are legally required to contractually engage with a packaging compliance scheme, such as the one operated by Landbell, to recover the packaging you have placed on the market.



Report information to the ZSVR

All information reported to a packaging scheme as part of your volume reporting must also be reported to the ZSVR. The packaging scheme also forwards the reported packaging volumes to the ZSVR for reconciliation.



Do I have to do all this myself?

Registration and reporting to the ZSVR are your personal duty and may not be contracted out to a third party.

However, Landbell can help you prepare for registration, reporting, and the recovery of your packaging volumes.



How to register in EASyShop:



1. Initial distributor?

If you are the first party to fill packaging with goods that end up with private consumers, then you are an initial distributor and therefore affected by VerpackG..



2. Registration

3. Contract

You can set up your participation contract right after you`ve registered. For an annual fee of 75 € (plus VAT), you can license up to 100 kilograms of paper/cardboard/cardboard packaging for Germany (equivalent to about 375 average-sized shipping cartons).



4. Volume reporting

You can easily submit your volume reports retroactively via EASyShop after the end of the year. Here, you can enter your circulated volumes by material fraction (cardboard, paper, carton, glass, aluminum, etc.).



5. Payment

You can conveniently pay by credit card, Paypal, Alipay or on account.
